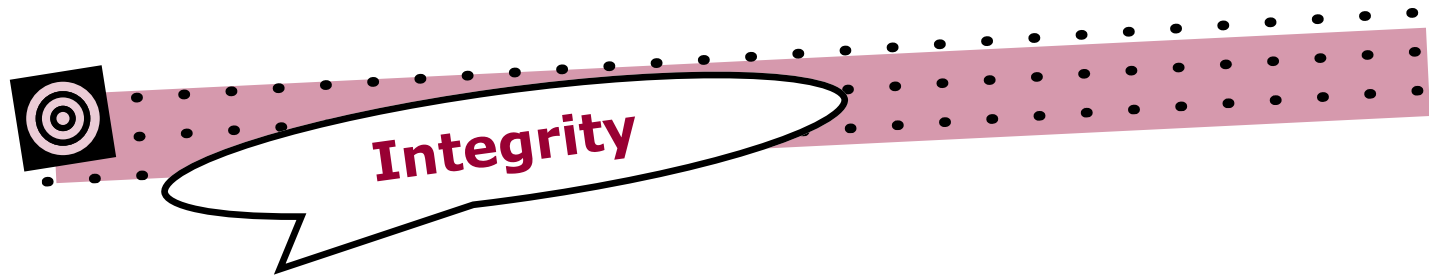

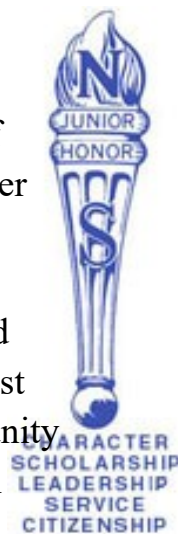

## Recipe of the Month:

### French Toast



**Cook time:** 15 minutes, **Yield:** Serves 4

#### INGREDIENTS:

- 4 eggs
- 2/3 cup milk
- 2 teaspoons of sugar
- (Vanilla, Cinnamon Optional)
- 8 slices of bread
- Butter
- Maple syrup
- Canola Spray

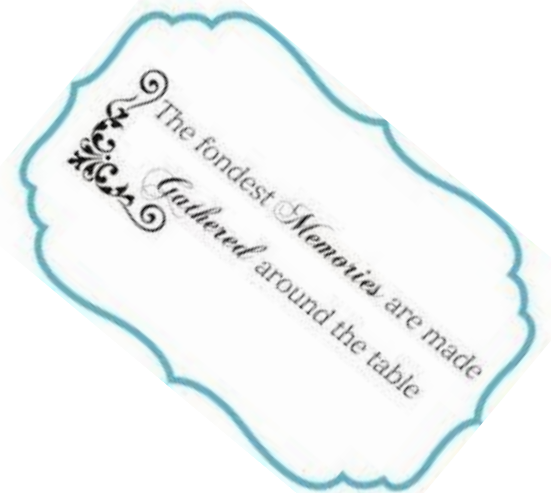
#### METHOD:

- 1** In a medium bowl, whisk together the eggs, milk, and sugar. Whisk the mixture until well blended and pour into a shallow bowl, wide enough to place a slice of the bread you will be using.
- 2** Spray large skillet with Pam and place over medium heat. Place each slice of bread into the milk egg mixture, allowing the bread to soak in some of it. Shake off the excess, and place the bread slices onto the hot skillet.
- 3** Fry the French toast until browned on one side, then flip and brown the other side.

“**Recipe of the Month**” will be a monthly feature throughout the school year. Family meals are extremely valuable in staying engaged with your child, especially when you make the meal together. You can use the time to talk with your child about school, friends and life in general. Take it one step further and take your child with you while grocery shopping. This teaches them about planning, money and budgeting.

### **Intermediate Division-**

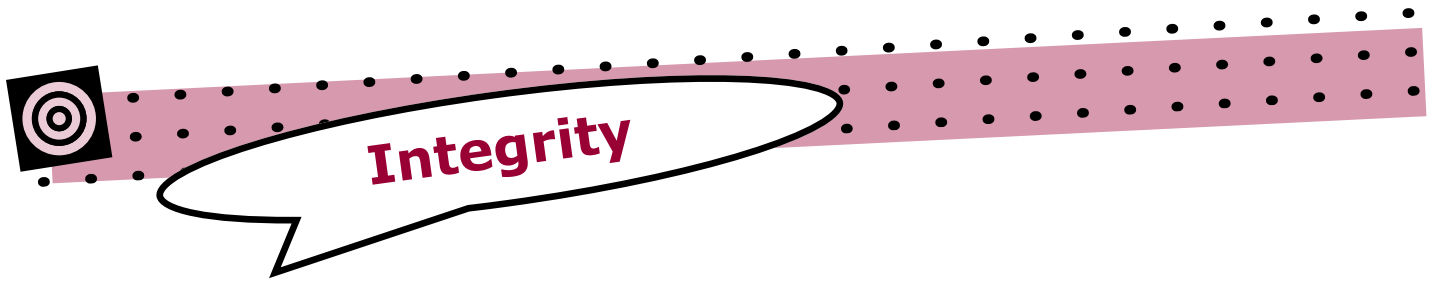
**1st Place:** Shantaya Cuesta
