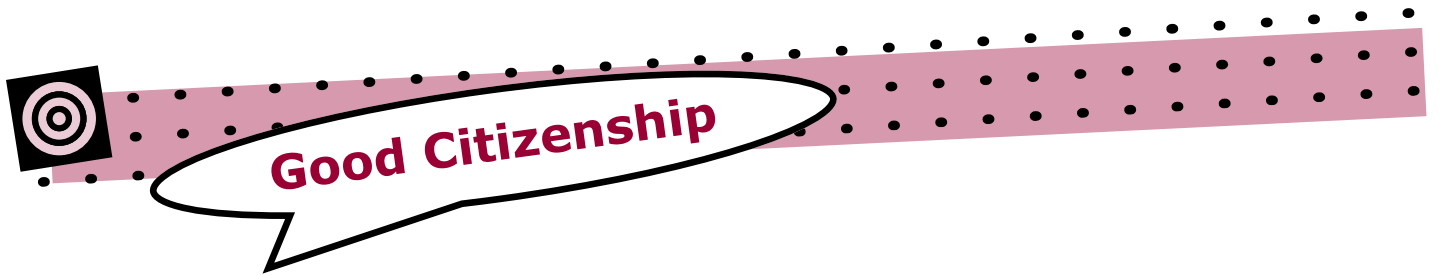

Coffee Talks:

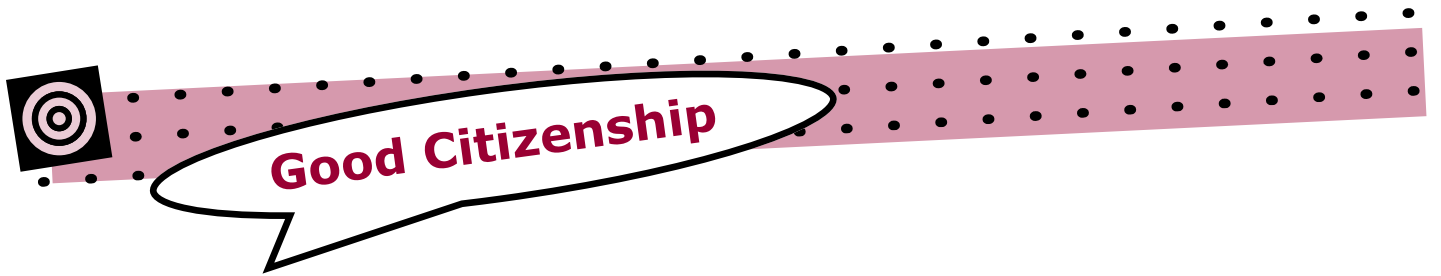

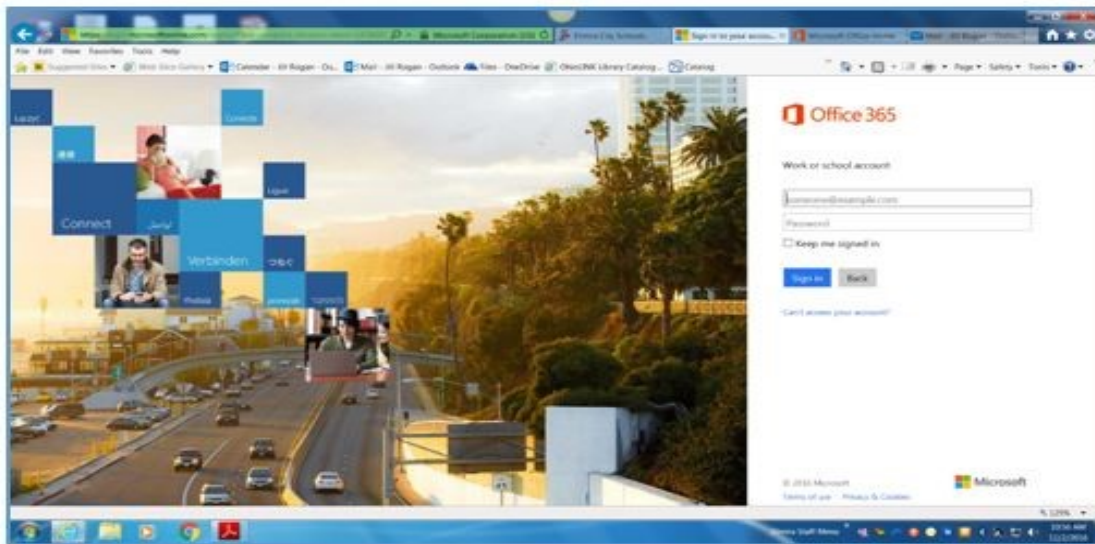

Recipe of the Month:

(Courtesy of Ms. Beaulieu and Cooking 101)

CREAMY BROCCOLI MAC AND CHEESE

Yield: 4 servings
Prep Time: 15 minutes
Cook Time: 15 minutes
Total Time: 30 minutes

INGREDIENTS:

8 ounces medium pasta shells
2 tablespoons unsalted butter
2 cloves garlic, minced
1 shallot, minced
2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
1 1/3 cups whole milk
1 cup half and half
1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
3 cups chopped broccoli florets
6 ounces extra-sharp cheddar cheese, grated

DIRECTIONS:

1. In a large pot of boiling salted water, cook pasta according to package instructions; drain well.
2. Melt butter in a large skillet over medium high heat. Add garlic and shallot, and cook, stirring frequently, until fragrant, about 2 minutes.
3. Whisk in flour until lightly browned, about 1 minute. Gradually whisk in milk, half and half and Dijon until slightly thickened, about 3-4 minutes. If the mixture is too thick, add more milk as needed; season with salt and pepper, to taste.
4. Stir in pasta, broccoli and cheese until well combined, about 3-4 minutes.
5. Serve immediately.

“Recipe of the Month” will be a monthly feature throughout the school year. Family meals are extremely valuable in staying engaged with your child, especially when you make the meal together. You can use the time to talk with your child about school, friends and life in general. Take it one step further and take your child with you while grocery shopping. This teaches them about planning, money and budgeting.

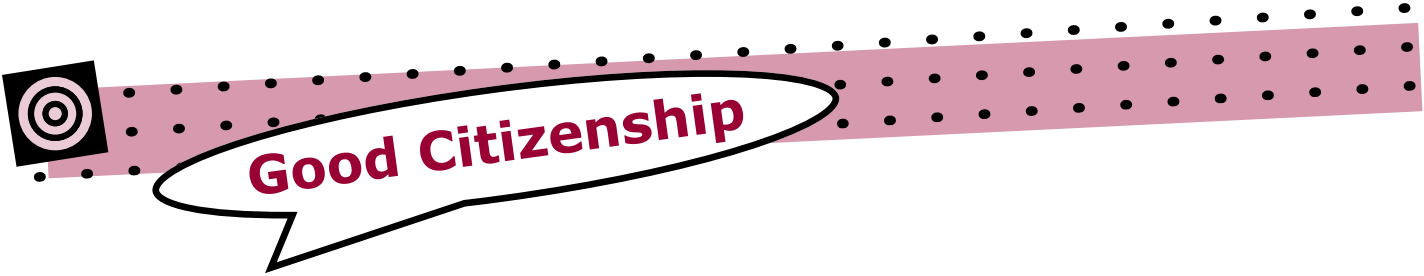
