### "WHAT DID YOU LEARN TODAY?"



Here's a pic from Mrs. Cornacchio's class. It's called a Learning Reflection Meter, and we use them in our classrooms

to encourage students to reflect on our lessons. In your child's class, they may use thumb's up/down instead, but what we're asking your child is this: *What did you learn? Did you understand the lesson?* They either "got it," "sort of," or "not yet." **Learning is a process that takes time.** At home, ask your children what they're learning about in school and if they are understanding what they've learned. Encourage your child to keep trying! Eventually, they will "get it."

## SUPER TEACHERS!

"Mrs. West is an exceptionally positive and patient teacher. My son feels incredibly comfortable with her, and that makes it so much easier for me to feel confident about his experiences at school. A good example of this is the time my son noticed there was a sticker on the page of a book in class, but Mrs. West asked him not to peel it off, because it might rip the page. The next day, he did take the sticker off, and instead of getting upset with him for doing something she'd asked him not to do, she focused on the positive and told him that he'd done a great job in making the book easier for everyone to read.
